\*Keynote: Fahrenheit 372: Libraries and the Law (John McGraw and Clare Graham, Faulkner-Van Buren Regional Library and Malvern-Hot Springs County Library)

Two non-lawyers discuss Act 372, which claims to address objectionable material in libraries. A temporary injunction halted portions of the law concerning public libraries, and a trial is scheduled in 2024. Where do libraries stand today?

\*Session #1: Adventures in Artificial Intelligence: Exploring the Good, the Bad, and the Ugly (April Sheppard, Arkansas State University)

Join me as we explore the good and bad of artificial intelligence (AI). From copyright issues and bias concerns, to accessibility and work productivity, we'll touch on a wide range of shortcomings and benefits on using AI in a library or academic environment. We will also discuss how AI already impacts our library work and patron expectations. Finally, we will conduct live examples of ChatGPT and Microsoft Designer, including examples of ways we could use AI in our library work.

\*Session #3: Bookworm Babes Book Club (Barbi Stull and Lyndsey Ammons)

We started with a group of 4 strangers and nearly 9 years later our Facebook group has grown to nearly 300.
